There are elements of risk that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Regardless of how you decide to use the slopes, always show courtesy to others, please adhere to the Alpine Responsibility Code and share with others the responsibility for a safe outdoor experience.

You must be able to stop, or avoid other people or objects 2 Do not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above 3 If you are involved in or witness a collision or accident, you must remain at the scene and identify yourself to the Ski Patrol 4 Observe and obey all posted signs and warnings 5 You must not use lifts or terrain if your ability is impaired through use of alcohol or drugs | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 6 People ahead of you have the right-of-way. It is your responsibility to avoid them 7 Before starting downhill or merging onto a trail look uphill and yield to others 8 Always use proper devices to help prevent runaway equipment 9 Keep off closed trails and closed areas 10 You must have sufficient physical dexterity, ability and knowledge to safely load, ride and unload lifts. If in doubt, ask the lift attendant. |
